PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND THE SURGERY IF YOU HAVE COVID SYMPTOMS OR A POSITIVE TEST RESULT (except by agreement with a clinician).

Medicine Requests

If some medicines are available over the counter, we will encourage you to go and buy them and not request a prescription for them.

If a medicine is not on your repeat list, it will not be authorised. You will be sent a text or contacted in some other way, regarding what you will need to do.

Dispensary require 72 hours to turn around a repeat request—please protect yourself and respect the workload of our staff by not leaving things to the last minute.

Doctor Appointments

Please be mindful that with the increased demand on general practice and rising patient numbers—there is sadly no such thing as 'a quick word on the phone' with the GP.

If your query is non-urgent, such as a results query, we would be very grateful if you could book a routine appointment.

This allows our GPs to deal with those who are acutely sick and helps us manage demand at this challenging time.
